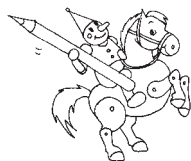


A hundred years later a handsome prince found the palace. A very thick and thorny hedge had grown around the palace and the prince took his sword to hack his way through.

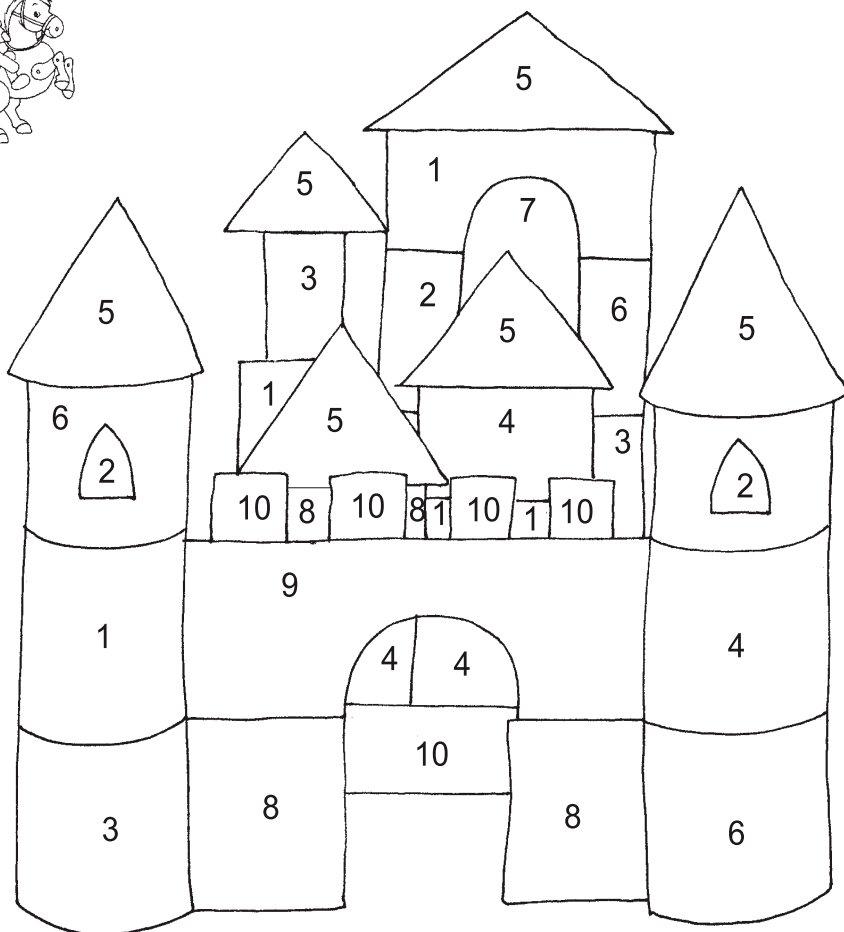
But as hard as he tried, he could not cut through the strong wood. He tried it the whole day and the next day and the next day and got weaker and weaker...

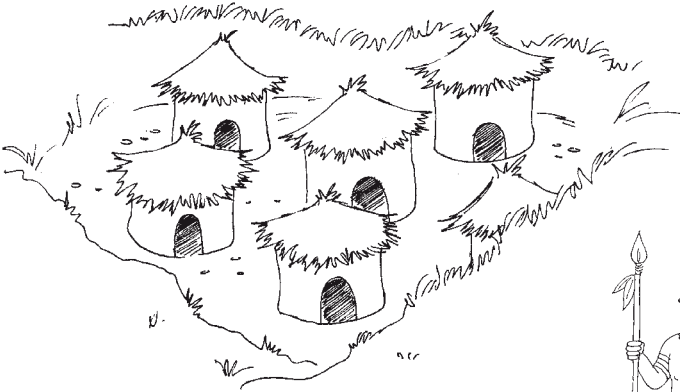

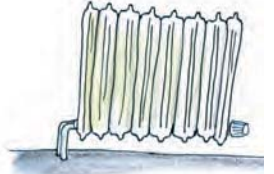

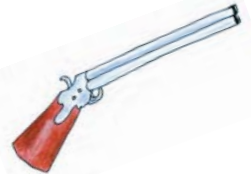
